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PREFACE

The Annual Report of the Nagaland Information Commission for the year 2012-13 has been published as scheduled. This is attributable to the prompt response of the Public Authorities of the Government of Nagaland to the request of the Nagaland Information Commission to submit their implementation report on RTI Act, 2005 and the proactive disclosures as required under Section 25(1) and Section 4 of the RTI Act, 2005 within a specific time frame. The hard work put in by the officers and staff of the Nagaland Information Commission is also another factor in the timely publication of the Annual Report for 2012-13. The Nagaland Information Commission wishes to place on record its deep appreciation to the Administrative and Directorate Heads of the Public Authorities and to the officers and staff of the Nagaland Information Commission for their support and cooperation.

Some special features of the Annual Report of 2012-13 which are being projected for the first time and are worthy of mention are:- (i) Status of distribution of RTI applications received during 2012-13 (ii) RTI applications received and furnished at district level during 2012-13, (iii) RTI applications received within and outside the State at the district levels during 2012-13, (iv) Gender-wise RTI applications filed at various levels during 2012-13, (v) No. of cases, PIOs penalized, penalty imposed and disciplinary action recommended from 2006-07 to 2012-13, and (vi) Comparative Analysis of grounds for First Appeal, Complaints and Second Appeals during 2011-12 and 2012-13.

The number of RTI applications as well as Second Appeals filed before the Nagaland Information Commission during the period under report has also shown marked increases. The increase in the number of RTI applications filed by citizens is reflective of their growing awareness of the provisions of the RTI Act, 2005 which can be attributed to the sensitisation and awareness programmes initiated by the Nagaland Information Commission and NGOs and other civil societies. The number of second appeals filed before the Nagaland Information Commission which has also shown an increase, reflects the dissatisfaction with the responses of some PIOs and FAAs and also an assertion of their rights by citizens to seek redressal of their grievances through the Nagaland Information Commission.

It is hoped that the Annual Report would prove useful in giving its readers a bird's eye view of the overall implementation of the RTI Act, 2005 in Nagaland over the years and particularly during 2012-13.

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1. Introduction

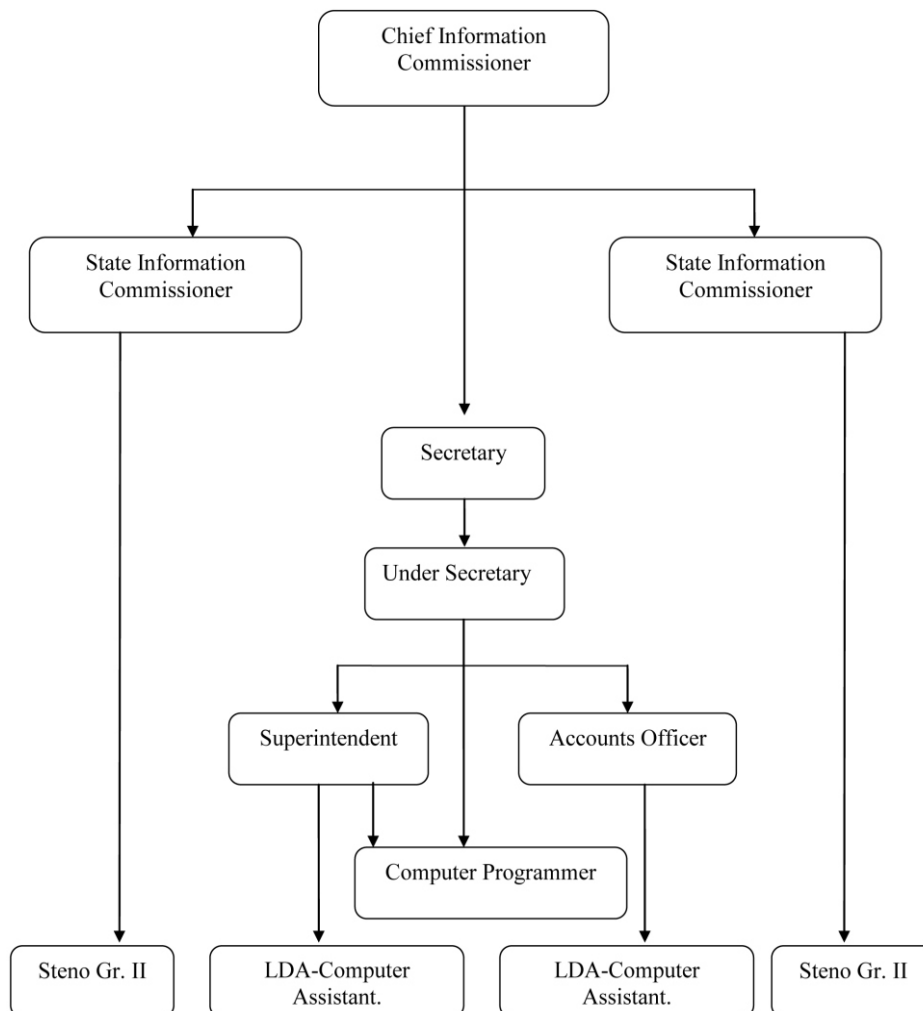
The Nagaland State Information Commission was constituted vide State Government Notification No. AR-3/Gen-147/2005 dated 14.3.2006 under Section 15 of the RTI Act, 2005 with the appointment of a State Chief Information Commissioner and two State Information Commissioners. The Commission started functioning from the date of constitution with its Headquarter at Kohima. The present team of the Chief Information Commissioner, Shri. Lalhuma, IAS (Retd) and the two State Information Commissioners, namely; Smti. Kevinino P. Meru and Shri. Bukchem Phom, were administered oath of office on 14.03.2011 forenoon.

2. The Nagaland Information Commission

The Commission is headed by the Chief Information Commissioner and is supported by two State Information Commissioners. The RTI Act provides that the State Government shall provide to the Chief Information Commissioner and the State Information Commissioners with such officers and employees as may be necessary for the efficient performance of their functions under the Act.

The Secretary, Nagaland Information Commission(NIC) oversees the functioning of the administrative department. She is assisted by an Under Secretary, Superintendent, Accounts Officer, ministerial and Grade-IV staff as given in the organizational chart. The total number of employees including the Information Commissioners stands at **27 (twenty seven)**.

2.2. Registration/Admission of NIC in NFICI:

Since August, 2011, the Nagaland Information Commission became a registered member of the National Federation of Information Commissions in India (NFICI) which has its headquarter at Hyderabad, by paying a one time 'registration fee' of Rs.5.00 lakhs and an amount of Rs.1.00 lakh only as annual membership fee. Shri. Lalhuma, IAS (Retd), Chief Information Commissioner, Nagaland is one of the members of the Board of Governors of the Federation.

3. Participation of CIC & SICs and other officials in various National level Conventions, Seminars and workshops etc.:

- 1) Shri Lalhuma, Chief Information Commissioner, Nagaland attended a 2 (two) days meeting of the NFICI on the 14th & 15th July, 2012 at Bangalore.
- 2) Shri Bukchem Phom, State Information Commissioner, Nagaland attended the 7th Annual Convention on RTI organised by the Central Information Commission from 12th & 13th October, 2012 held at the DRDO Bhawan, New Delhi.
- 3) Shri. Worhonthung Ezung, Under Secretary attended and given a powerpoint presentation during the one-day National Workshop on Best Practices in the implementation of RTI on 22nd May, 2012 held at the Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA), New Delhi, which was jointly organised by the IIPA and the Department of Personnel & Training(DOPT), New Delhi.
- 4) Shri. Worhonthung Ezung, Under Secretary was invited as resource person by the Directorate of Economics & Statistics on 5th and 16th November, 2012, and Office of the Commissioner of Taxes, Dimapur on 26th November, 2012.
- 5) Er. Chumbemo Kithan, Computer Programmer attended a training programme on 'E-Governance Project Life Cycle' at Hotel Legacy, Upper Bayavü, Kohima from 28th to 31st August, 2012 organized by the Department of Information Technology & Communication, Government of Nagaland.

4. Activities and achievements of the Nagaland Information Commission during 2012-13:

During 2012-13, the Nagaland Information Commission took up some innovative programmes to propagate and disseminate the RTI message which are highlighted as under:-

4.1. Propagation of RTI:

- (i) **RTI Theme Song:** The Commission produced a RTI Theme Song in Nagamese, the common lingua franca, entitled '*Adhikar Janebo Lage*' for creating RTI awareness and popularising RTI. The RTI Theme Song was produced in collaboration with the Music Task Force, Youth Resources & Sports, Government of Nagaland. The song was sung by Mr. N. Mughai Achumi, Youth Pastor, Sumi Baptist Church, Purana Bazar, Dimapur and recorded at the Windy City Connection Recording Studio, Dimapur.
- (ii) **RTI Short Film:** The Commission also produced an RTI Short Film, '*My Right, My Voice*' in Nagamese with English subtitles, with the aim of popularising RTI and creating awareness among the local populace. Copies were distributed to the districts, sub-divisions and blocks for screening, aired on Doordarshan Kohima (DDK), broadcast on local TV channels and used in trainings and seminars. The RTI Short Film was produced in collaboration with "Dreamz Unlimited", Dimapur, a well-known local talent and film producer. Copies have also been replicated by the Rural Development Department for distribution to all VDBs (Village Development Blocks).

- (iii) **Essay Competition:** The Commission, in collaboration with "Youth Net" Kohima, a NGO comprising of young local advocates involved in RTI activities, conducted an Essay competition at college level in the State on the theme, ***"Role of Youth in bringing about good governance through RTI"***. The top three winners were awarded Certificate of Merit and prize money.

4.2. Observation of RTI Week, 2012:

Under the initiative and general supervision of the Nagaland Information Commission, RTI Week was celebrated from 5th to 12th October, 2012 throughout the State by organizing functions, display of RTI banners in prominent places and screening of RTI Short Film and the RTI Theme Song produced by the Nagaland Information Commission in all the districts and at some block levels with the assistance of audio-visual mobile vans available with the Department of Information & Public Relations in all the districts.

Financial support of Rs.5,000/- (Rupees five thousand only) to all the respective Deputy Commissioners and Rs. 4000/- (Rupees four thousand only) to all the District Public Relations Officers were granted to all the 11 (eleven) districts for organizing the RTI Week.

The following materials were also sent out to all the Deputy Commissioners and DPROs (District Public Relations Officers) in the districts for use during the RTI Week: RTI Theme Song on CD, RTI Short Film on CD for screening, printed Flex Banners for display in prominent places in all the districts, and a Printed Flex Banner for display on the vehicles used for screening of the RTI film.

The total expenditures on the observation of the RTI Week, 2012, totaling Rs. 2.50 lakhs covering all the districts were met out of the financial grants sanctioned by the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pension, Department of Personnel and Training, New Delhi for observation of RTI Week, 2012 under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme on "Improving Transparency and Accountability in Government through effective implementation of RTI".

The Nagaland Information Commission in collaboration with the Nagaland State Legal Services Authority (NSLSA) organized a special programme to launch the RTI Week, 2012 on the 5th October, 2012 in the Conference Hall of the Civil Secretariat, Kohima wherein AHODs/HODs, Special invitees, media persons and a host of members were present. Shri. Neiphiu Rio, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Nagaland graced the occasion as the Chief Guest with Shri. Lalhuma, IAS(Retd), Chief Information Commissioner, Nagaland in the chair.

During the special programme to launch the RTI Week, 2012, the Hon'ble Chief Minister and Chief Guest, Shri. Neiphiu Rio released the following:-

- a. RTI Theme Song, ***'Adhikar Janebo Lage'*** produced by the Nagaland Information Commission in collaboration with the Nagaland State Legal Services Authority (NSLSA) and the Music Task Force, Directorate of Youth Resources & Sports, Government of Nagaland.
- b. RTI Short Film entitled, ***'My Right, My Voice'*** in a DVD format produced by Dreamz Unlimited, Dimapur in collaboration with the Nagaland Information Commission and Nagaland State Legal Services Authority (NSLSA).

The Chief Guest also distributed prizes to the three winners of the college level Essay competition in the State on the topic, ***'Role of youth in bringing about good governance through RTI'***, which was organised by the Youth Net in collaboration with the Nagaland Information Commission. The winners of the essay competition were:-

1. First Prize : Ms. Medonguno M Chasie, St. Joseph College, Jakhama
2. Second Prize : Ms. Ketshunuo, Baptist College, Kohima
3. Third Prize : Mr. Alvin Solo, Immanuel College, Dimapur

The three prize winning essays are reproduced at **Annexure-A, B and C.**

During the function, the RTI Theme Song, '***Adhikar Janebo Lage***' was performed live by the composer, Shri. N. Mughai Achumi, Youth Pastor, Sumi Baptist Church, Purana Bazar, Dimapur. The lyrics of the RTI Theme Song (in Nagamese) have been appended at Annexure-D.

The RTI Short Film entitled, '***My Right, My Voice***' in a DVD format was also screened in the Conference Hall and earned favourable response from the viewers present.

In all the districts, Quiz Competition was held at college levels. The RTI Theme Song, '***Adhikar Janebo Lage***' and the RTI Short Film, '***My Right, My Voice***' produced by the Nagaland Information Commission was also played and screened in all the district headquarters and some block levels with the support of the Department of Information and Public Relations in the Districts.

The RTI Short Film, '***My Right, My Voice***' was also given to the Dordarshan Kendra Kohima for telecast and the RTI Theme Song, '***Adhikar Janebo Lage***' to All India Radio for broadcasting during the RTI Week, 2012.

4.4. Sensitisation of APIOs, PIOs, FAA of Public Authorities on RTI:

The Sensitization-cum-Interactive sessions on RTI which was kick started in 2011 and initially covered 1219 officials representing 58 public authorities and subsequently 34 officials covering 4 PSUs has continued till date.

The Interactive sessions which followed each power point presentation made by the Public Authorities and by the Information Commission during the Sensitization-cum-Interactive sessions on RTI proved to be very educative and enlightening. During the sessions, important and pertinent issues and problems were highlighted and recommendations made to resolve these problems and issues etc.

Through the RTI Short film and RTI Theme song produced by the Nagaland Information Commission and also other publications, the Commission has been carrying out sensitization programmes in all the districts and sub-divisions. A clear outcome of these initiatives is the yearly increase of RTI applications filed by citizens before public authorities averaging 37.90% increase from 2011-12 to 2012-13.

4.5. Compilation of the Commission's decisions and Orders:

In addition to uploading its decisions/orders etc. on the Commission's website, the Commission has compiled all its year-wise decisions and orders passed in hard copies since its inception in 2006 till date.

5. Other initiatives.

5.1 District tours:

With the successful conduct of the Sensitisation-cum-interactive sessions on RTI for public authorities and PSUs based in Kohima and Dimapur, the Commission has chalked out programmes to visit all the Districts HQs and ADC HQs to sensitise the district officials and NGOs, and also to monitor the implementation of RTI.

5.2 Publication of various RTI materials:

The Commission has brought out various publications for popularizing RTI and for creating awareness amongst the local populace. The following initiatives were also taken up to propagate RTI among the citizens and Government functionaries.

- (i) Bare RTI Act, 2005 and the RTI Rules (in English) were printed and distributed during district tours, Road Shows, trainings, workshops and seminars etc.
- (ii) RTI Act, 2005 has been translated into the 12 out of 16 officially recognised tribal/local dialects and are being disseminated by the District Administration, NGOs and when citizens ask for them. These are also available on the website at www.nlsic.gov.in. The translations in the four (4) remaining dialects are expected to be completed by 2013.
- (iii) A pamphlet on Citizens' Guide on RTI in English developed and translated in all the local dialects are being distributed during the RTI Week, awareness campaigns and as and when citizen ask for it. These are also available on the website at www.nlsic.gov.in

- (iv) Booklet on RTI Handbook developed by the Nagaland Information Commission.
- (V) "Guide on RTI Act, 2005" of Department of Personnel & Training (DOPT), Government of India was re-printed for mass distribution to PIOs, APIOs, Officers, NGOs and citizens.

The Commission has also initiated works on the following projects:-

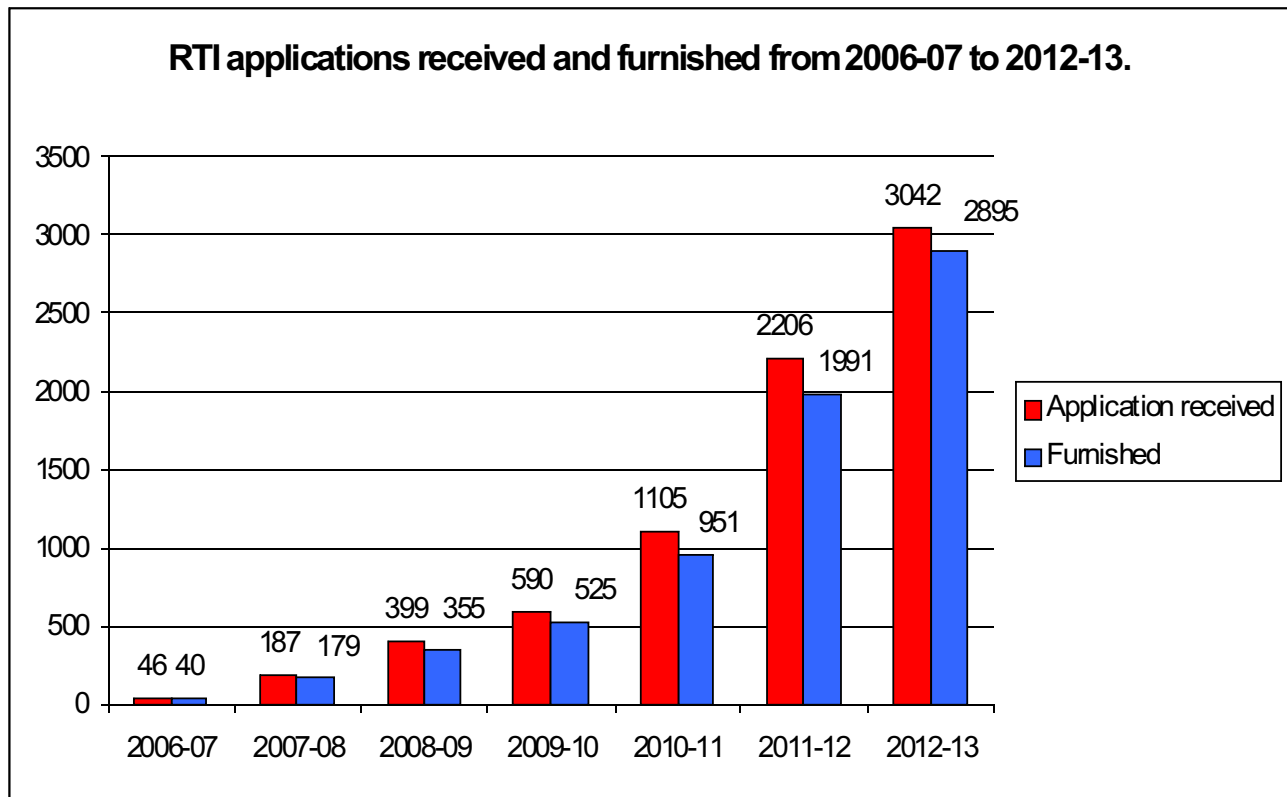
- (i) Publication of Directory of FAA/PIOs/APIOs of Government Departments and PSUs for distribution to all public authorities.
- (ii) Printing of RTI Act, 2005 in English and in all the officially recognized local dialects for wide distribution with a view to popularizing RTI and creating awareness amongst the local populace.
- (iii) Printing of pamphlet on "Citizens' Guide to RTI" in English and in local dialects for distribution with the view of popularizing RTI and creating awareness amongst the local populace.

6. Annual Report on implementation of RTI Act, 2005 for the period 2012-13.

Under Section 25 (1) of the RTI Act, 2005, the Nagaland Information Commission is required as soon as practicable after the end of each year (*financial*), to prepare a report on the implementation of the provision of the Act during the year and forward a copy thereof to the appropriate Government, and under Section 25(4) of the said Act, to cause a copy of the report to be laid before the State Legislature. The Annual Report for the year 2012-13 has been prepared based on information furnished by the Public Authorities of the State Government and is reflected at Annexure- E.

6.1. A summary of the implementation of the RTI Act, 2005 in Nagaland from 2006-07 to 2012-13.

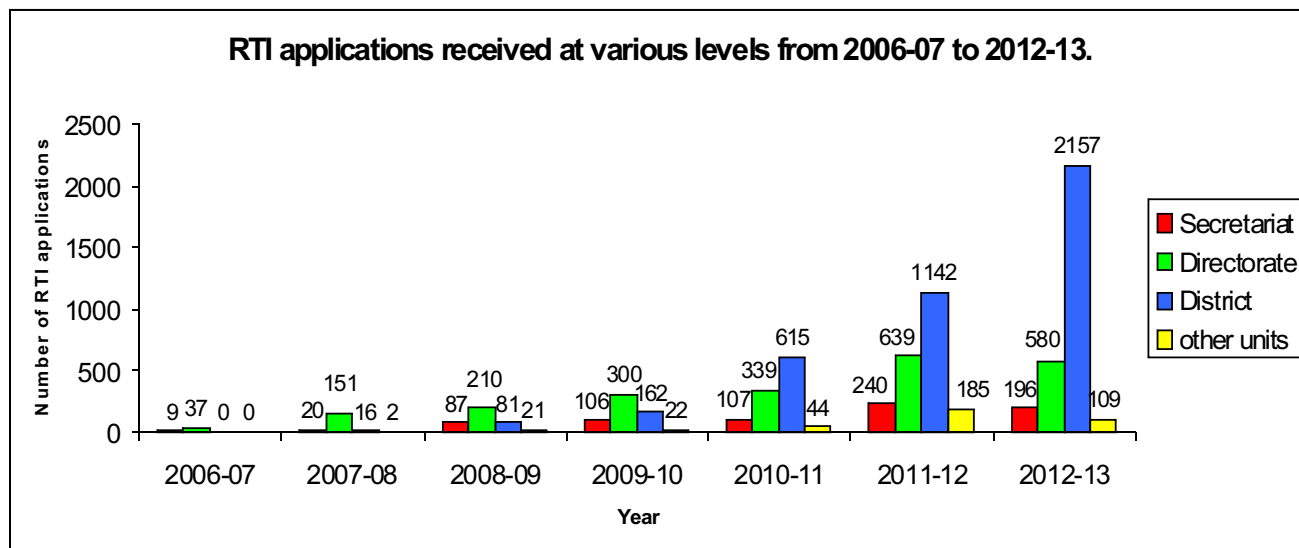
The total number of RTI applications received and furnished by the various public authorities in the State of Nagaland since the inception of the Nagaland Information Commission in 2006 upto the end of 31st March, 2013 is shown below:-



The chart above indicates that there has been a steady increase in the number of RTI applications received by the various Public Authorities in the State of Nagaland, which reflects the growing awareness of RTI generated among the people.

During the period from 2011-12 to 2012-13, the number of RTI applications increased by 37.90%.

During 2012-13, the response of the PIOs of various Public Authorities to the RTI applications was very encouraging and averaged at 95.17%.

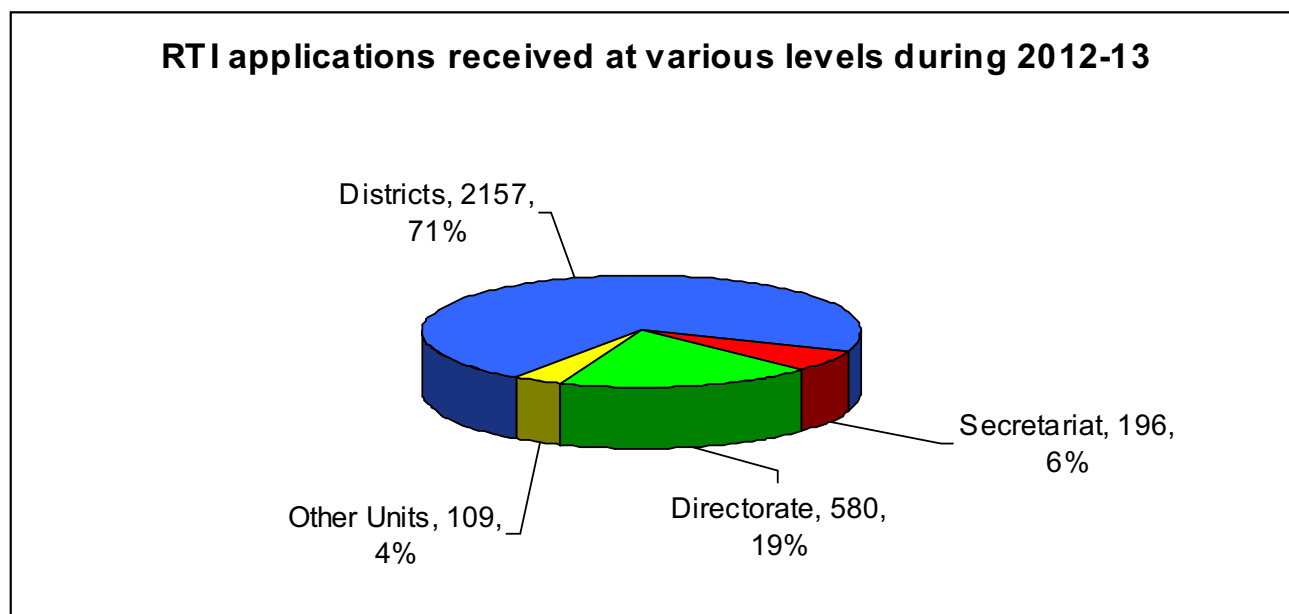


During the initial years since the inception of the Commission in 2006, the Directorates received the highest number of RTI applications from 2006-07 to 2009-10. However, from the year, 2010-11 onwards, there has been a shift, and RTI applications received in the Districts out numbered those received in the Directorates. This is perceived as a healthy trend and reflects growing awareness of RTI Act in the rural areas.

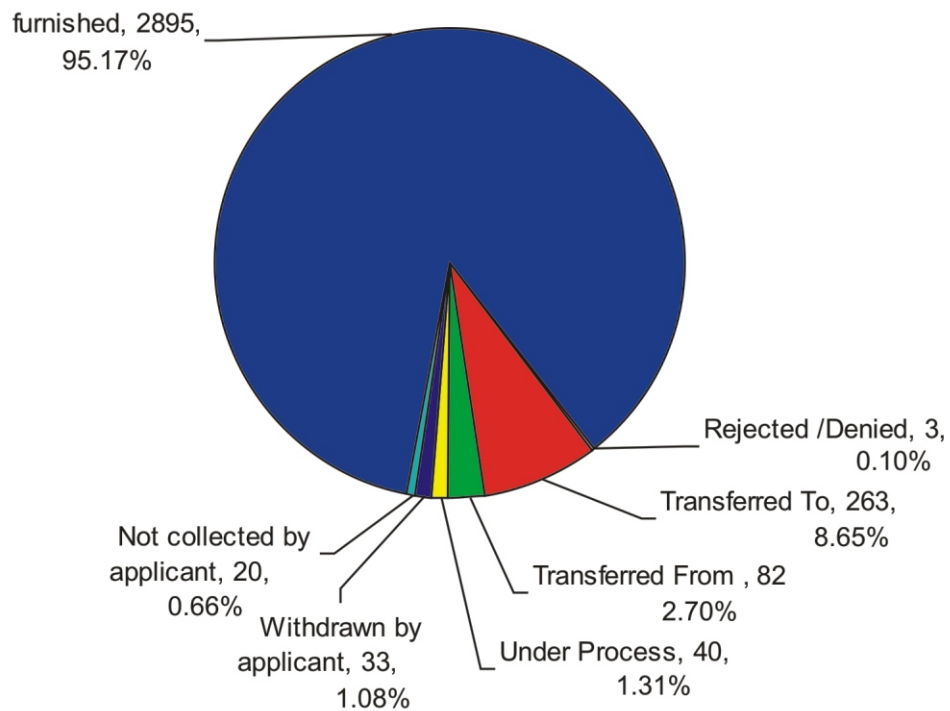

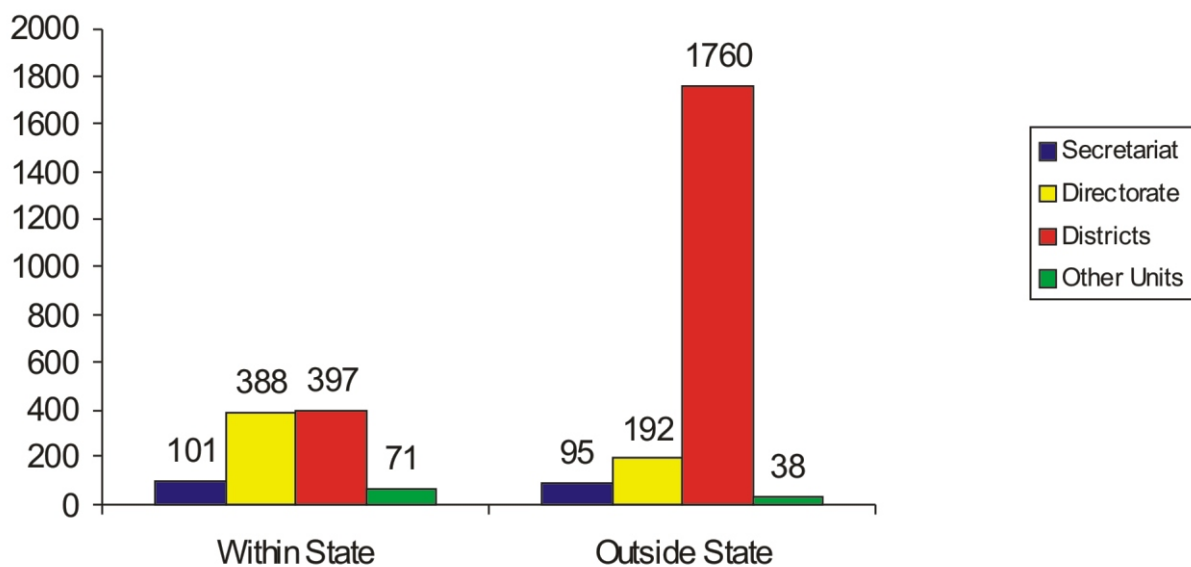


Status of distribution of RTI applications received during 2012-13.

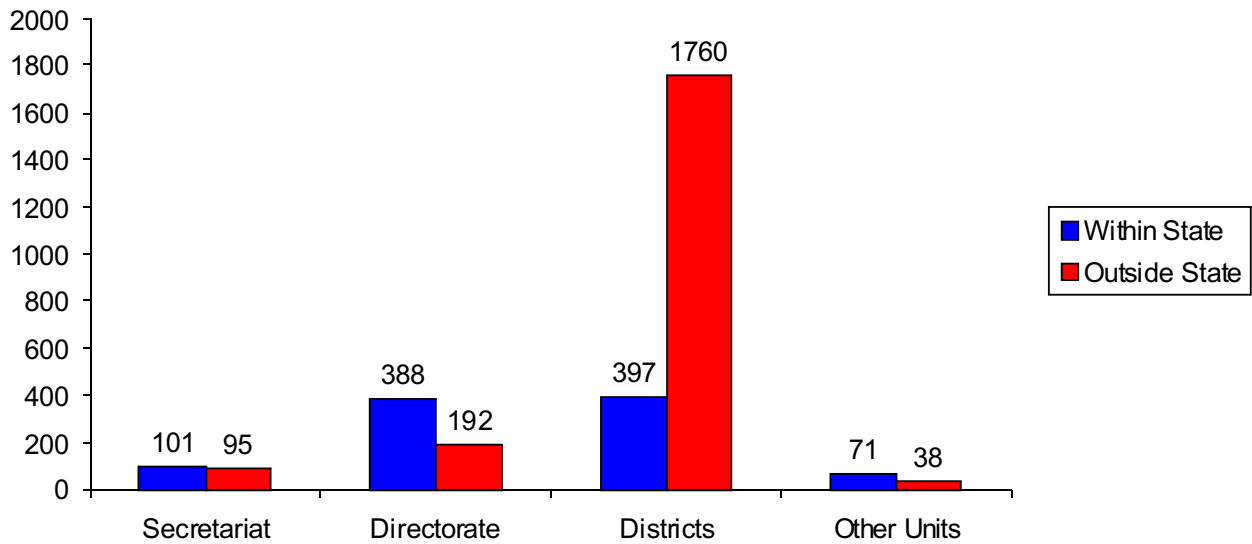


Total RTI applications received at various levels during 2012-13= 3042.

Cummulative RTI applications received from within and outside the State at various levels during 2012-13.

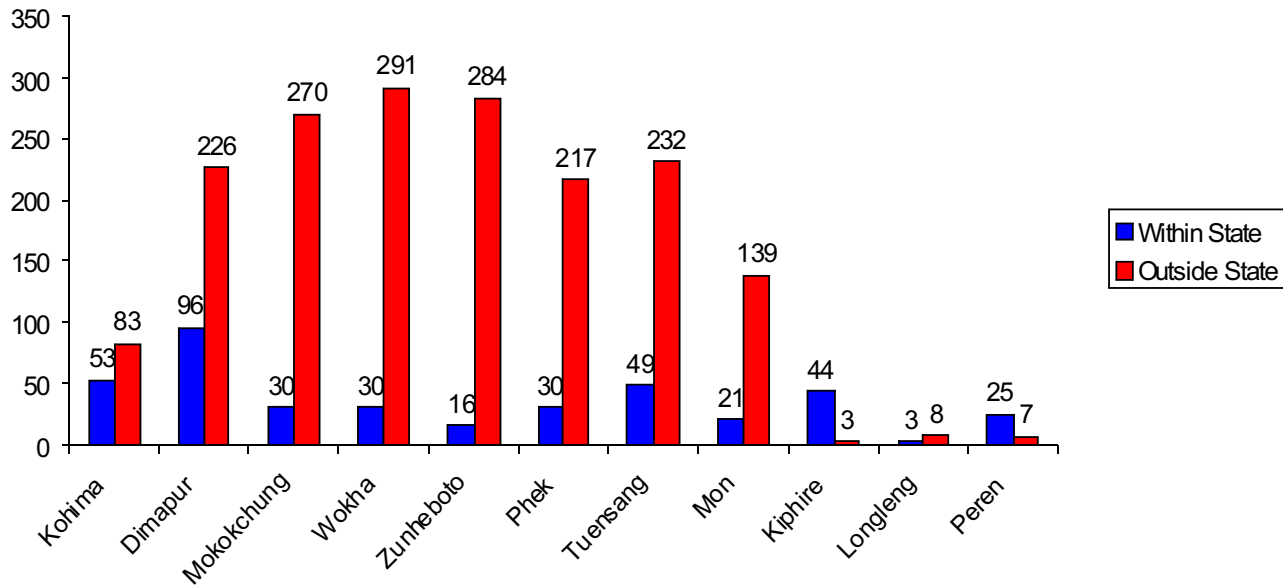


RTI applications received from within and outside the State at various levels during 2012-13.



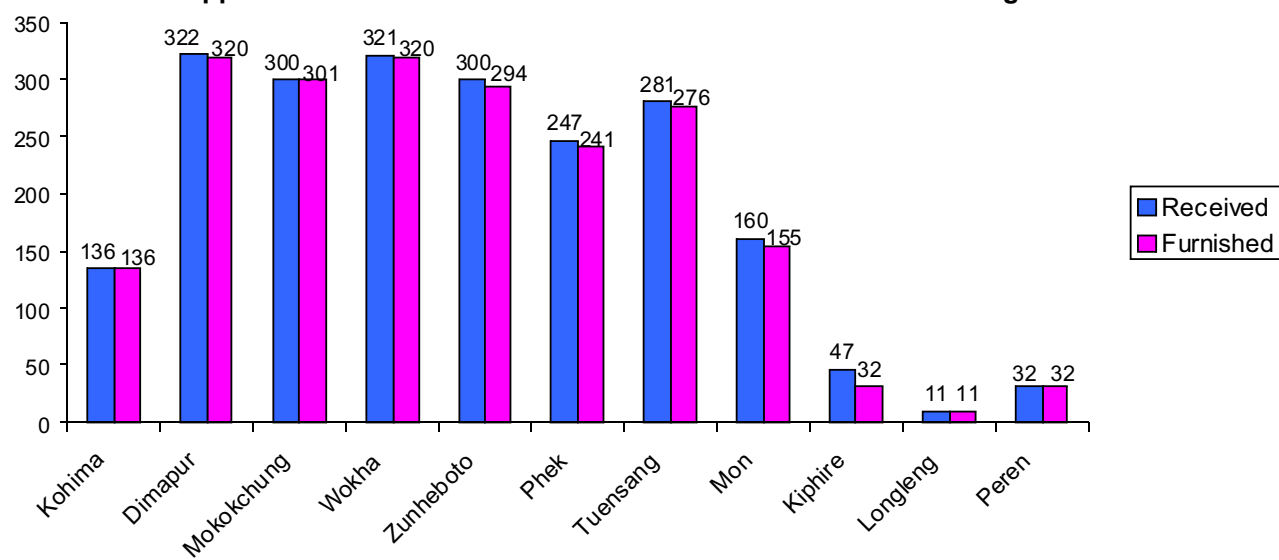
RTI applications received and furnished at the district level.

RTI applications received from within & outside the State at the district level during 2012-13.

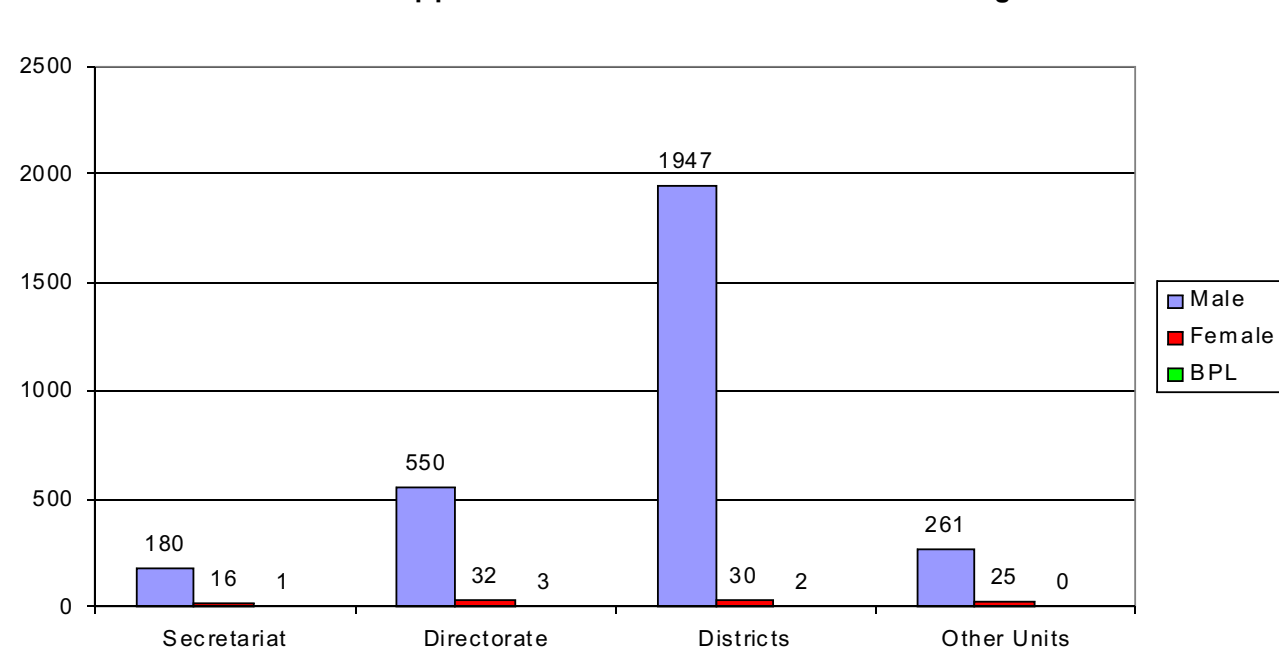


As shown above, during 2012-13, RTI applications received in the districts were from outside the State, except Kiphire & Peren districts.

Gender-wise RTI applications filed at various levels during 2012-13.

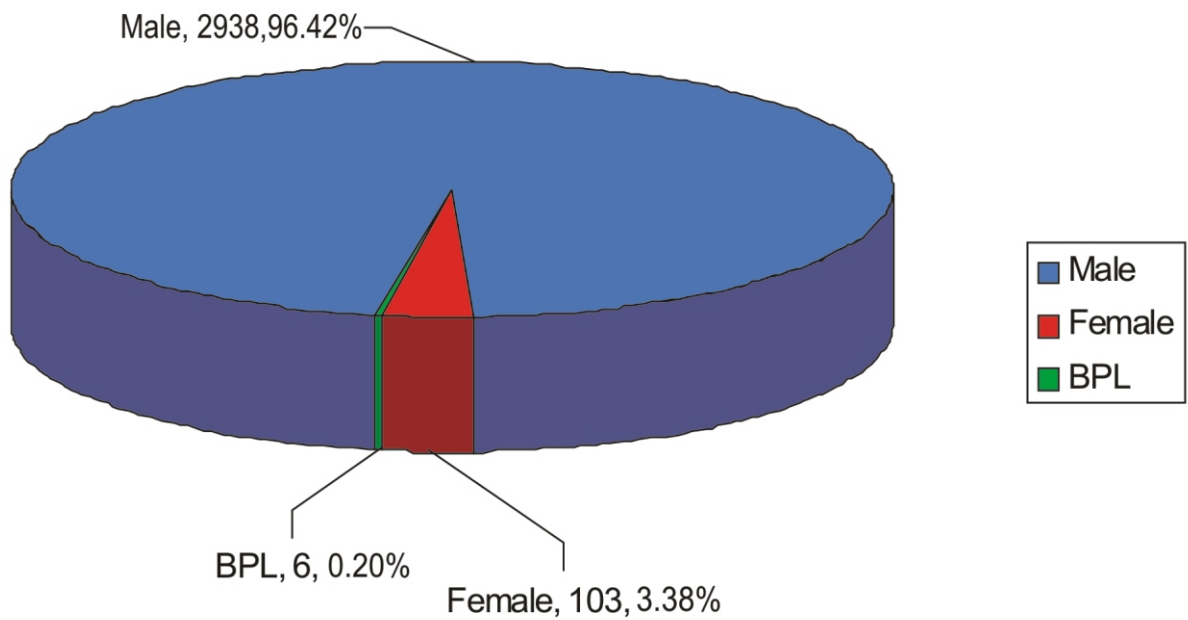


Gender-wise RTI applications filed during 2012-13.

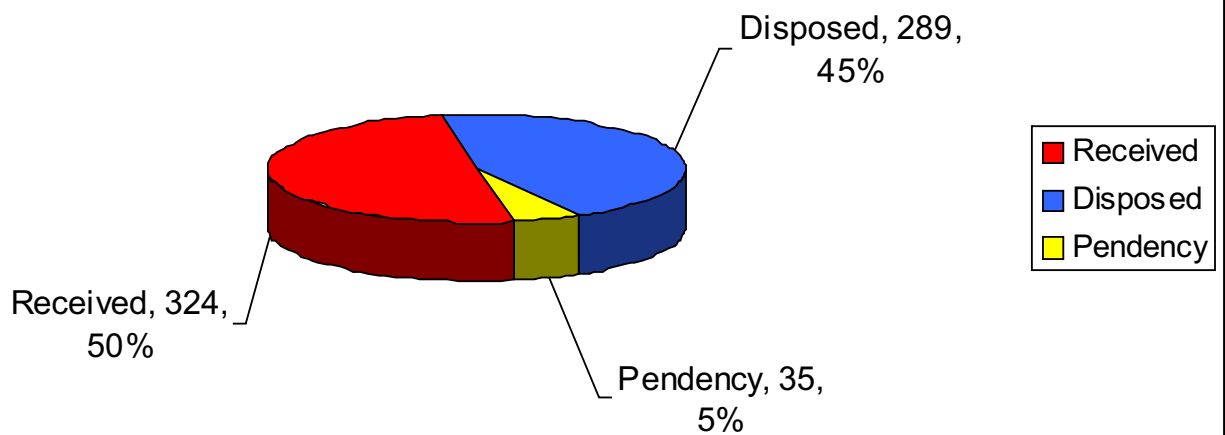

Gender-wise RTI applicants during 2012-13

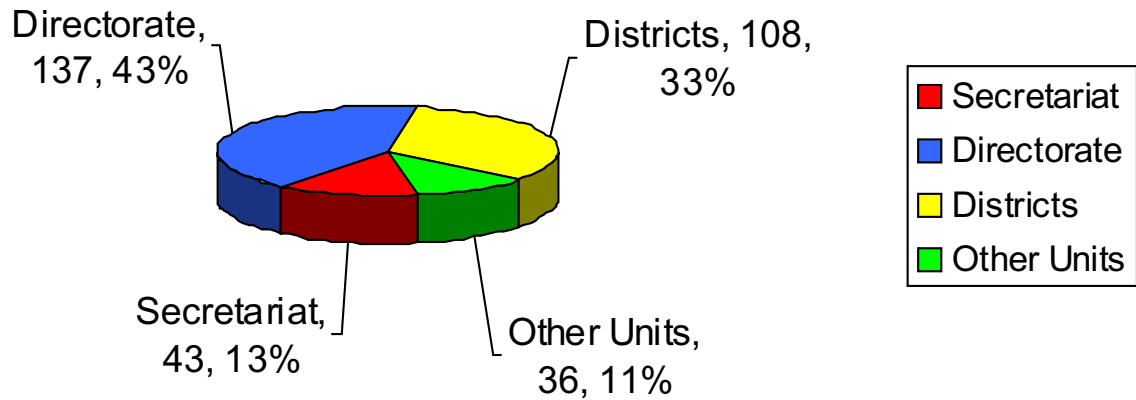


First Appeals received, disposed and pending during 2012-13.

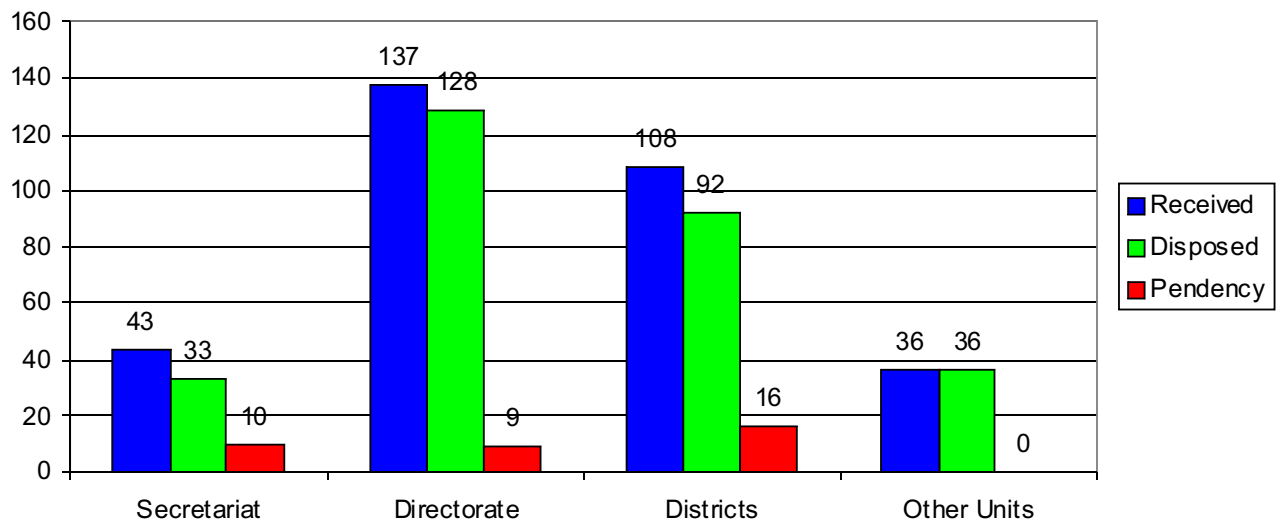
First Appeals received, disposed and pending during 2012-13.

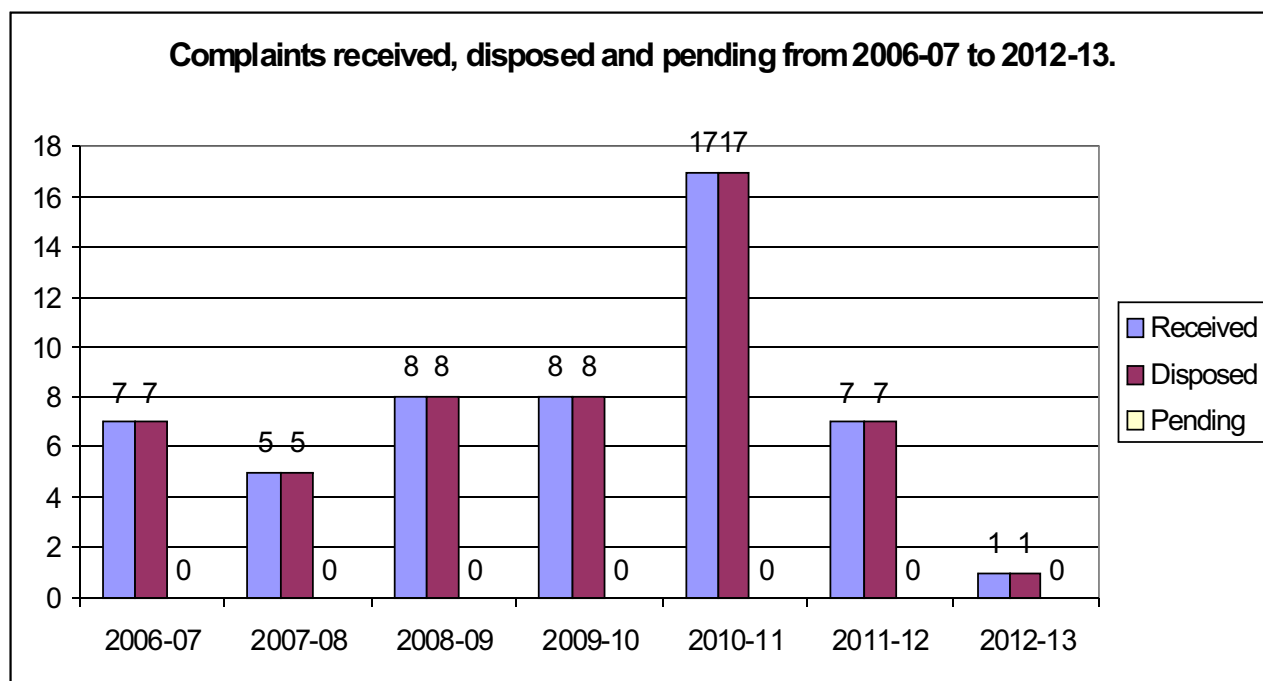

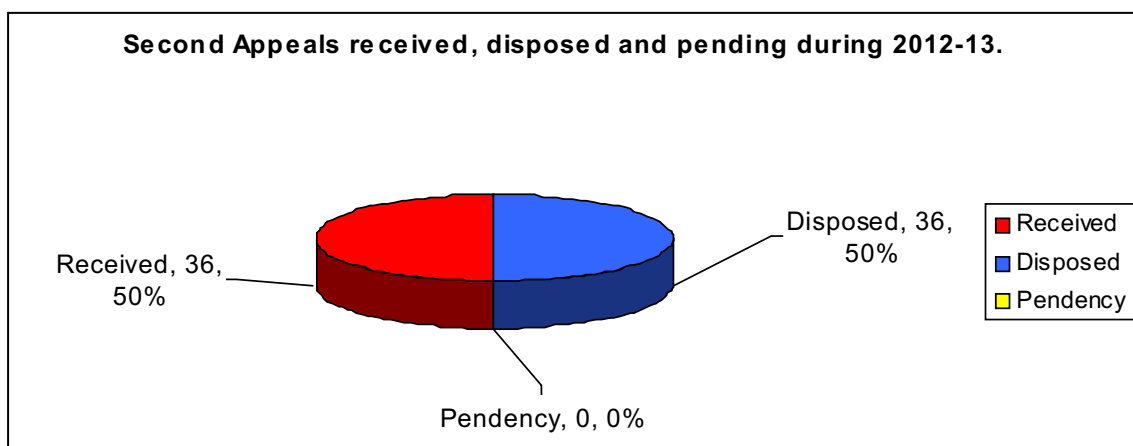

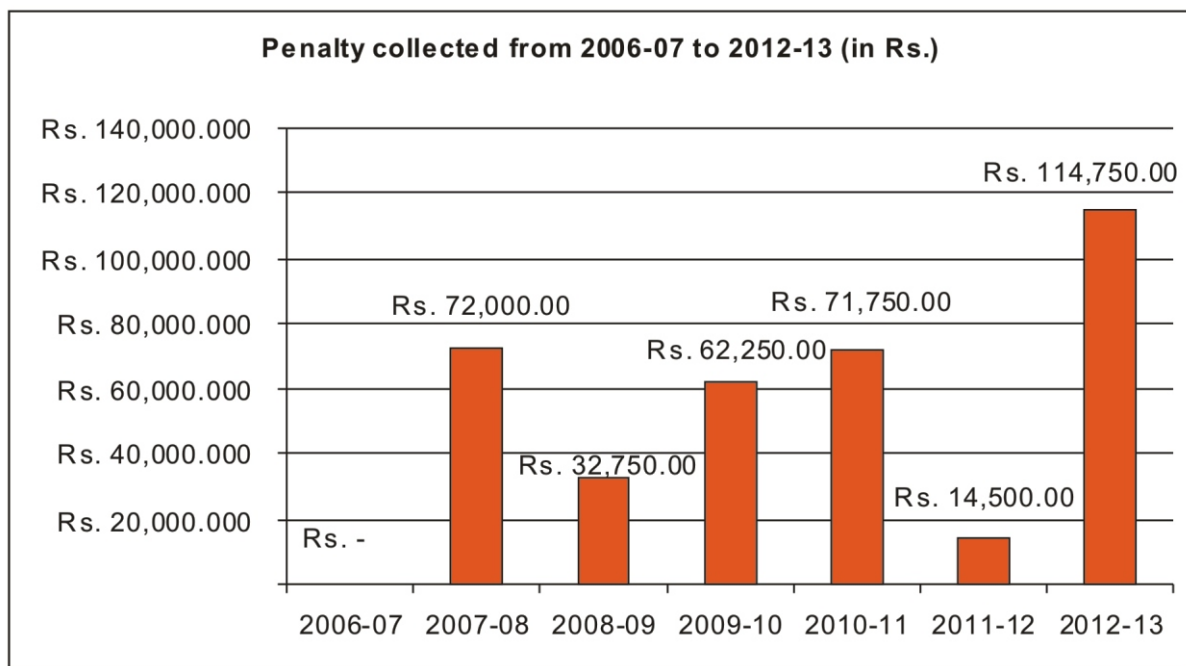

Cost of information collected from 2006-07 to 2012-13 (in Rs.)

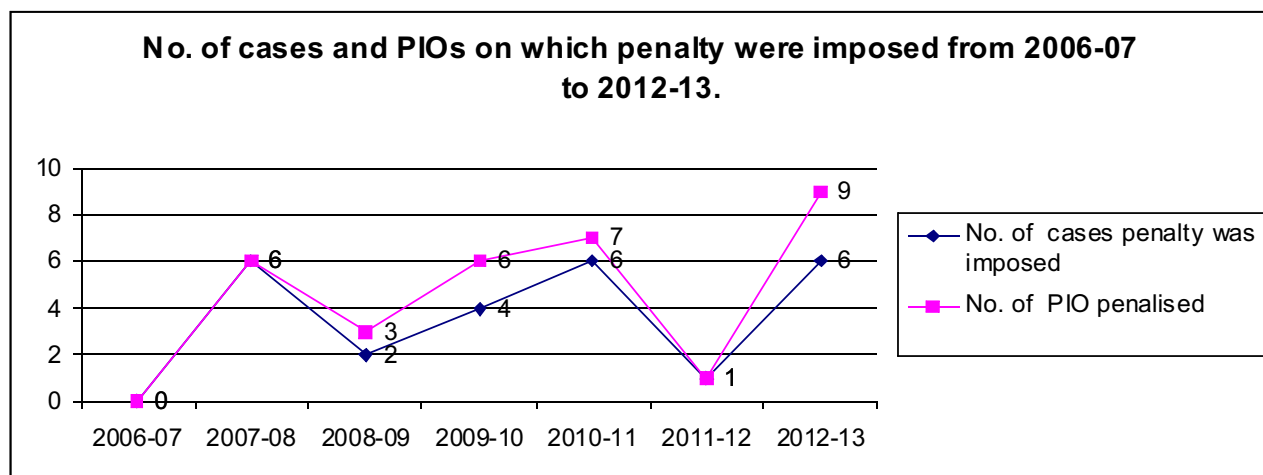




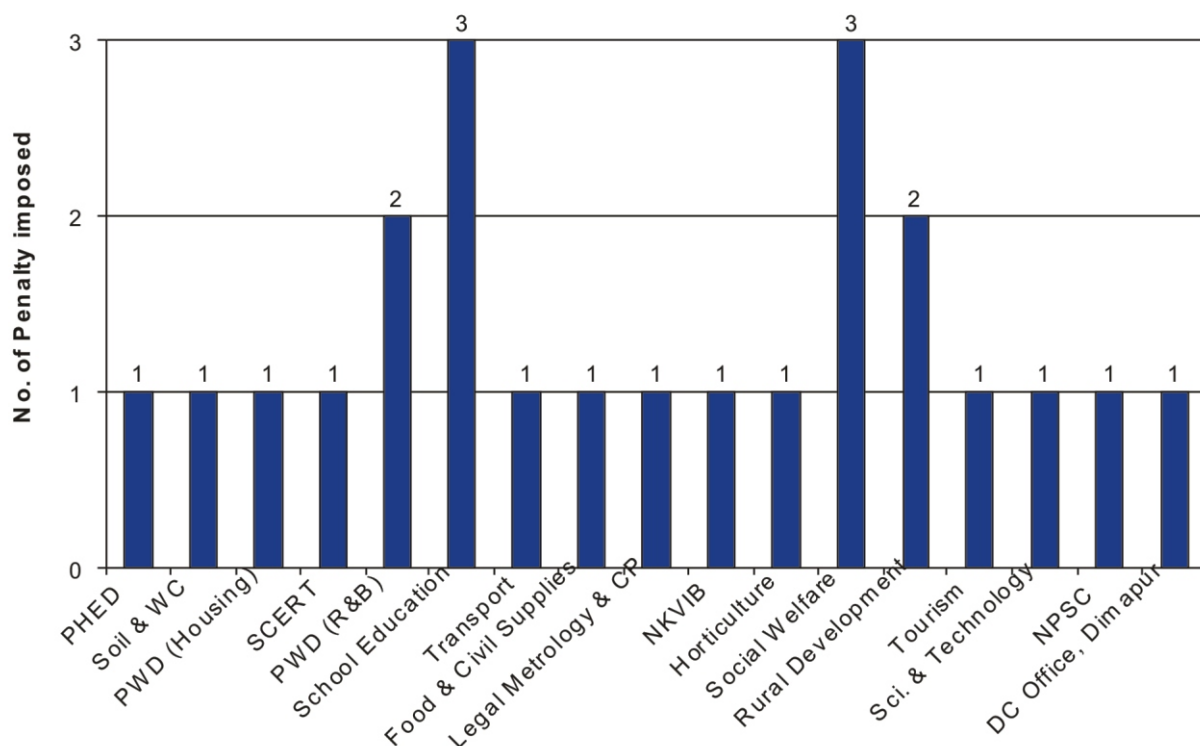

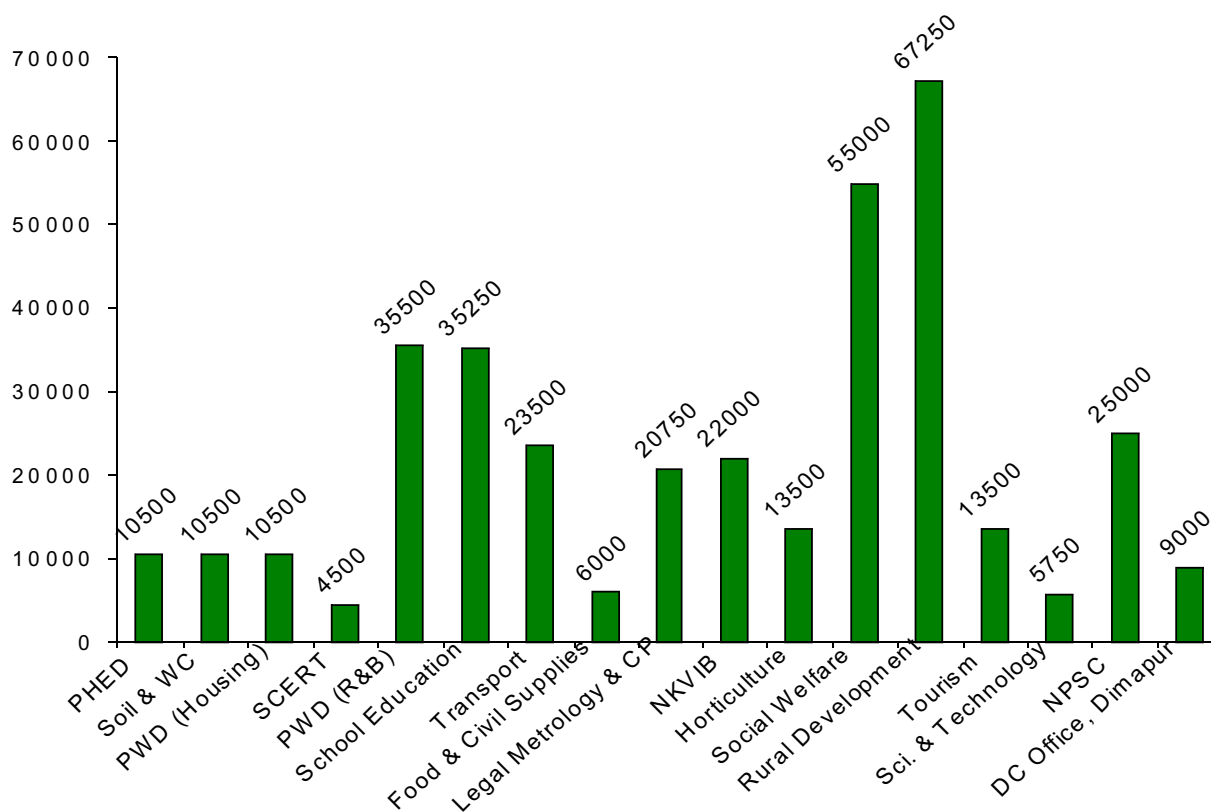

The right to information (RTI) is a law enacted by the parliament of India to provide out for setting to Right To Information for citizens to secure access to information under the control of public authorities, in order to promote transparency and accountability in the working of every public authority, the constitution of a central information commission and state information commissions and for matters connected with therewith or incidental thereto. The word "Information" has been derived from the Latin word "Formation" and "Forma" which means giving shape to something and forming patterns respectively. It was passed by parliament on 15 June 2005 and came fully into force on 12 October 2005.

The RTI act mandates to timely response to citizens request for government information. It applies to all states and union territories of India, except the state of Jammu and Kashmir, which is covered under a state-level law. This Act empowers the citizens of our country to actively participate in the governance of the society and give a befitting reply to corruption. RTI can be traced to the principles of natural justices to the rule "Audi alteram Pattern" hear the other side i.e, no persons shall be condemned unheard.

RTI Act is an important tool to reveal the practice of corruption in government office and public sectors. It is the right of every citizen to get information. Its main objective is to promote transparency and accountability in the working of every public authority and to contain corruption RTI provides practical regime of right to information across the country.

RTI portal gateway across the country quick search of information, web published by various departments in government. Its aim is to help the citizens in effective searching of information by the various government / departments and states. The Government of India which provides an opportunity for citizens to government information and its undertakings. The procedure to request for information based on the RTI Act is very simple and easy. The Right To Information Act operates on a central and state level and requires setting up of information commission for its implementation.

The Right To Information Act 2005 has worked as a powerful instrument to enhance the governance transparency. The first National youth convention based on RTI and democracy was held on 11th and 12th of January 2008, in Beawar, Rajasthan. The convention was attended by over 1000 young participants from both rural and urban areas of 11 states across the country. The convention was organized by NCPRI, along with Josh- the Delhi based group working with the youth, and other organizations from Rajasthan like the MKSS, the Jaipur based RTI support group and citizens group in Beawar, including the daily local Newspaper Nirantar the two day convention was held to discuss and focus on the crucial role of youth can play in strengthening democracy through the use of RTI on issues of social importance.

The convention was structured with sessions on role of youth in Democracy and politics, along with workshops of various concerns like negative impact of globalization, gender, communal politics, agriculture, state of Dalits and Adivasis, budget analysis, human rights, right to information, National rural employment guarantee Act, education and employment and others. The main objectives of these workshops was to create a general understanding on these issues, the challenges and areas, the problems, on role of youth can play in addressing these concerns, the role that right to information can play in facilitating these problems and finally draw out a plan for action. These workshops were facilitated by various eminent resource person like Jean Dreze, the MKSS team (Aruna Roy, Nikhil Dey, Shanklar Singh and others), Vrinda Grover, Aseem Srivastav, Amit Kunwar, Jogendra Bhagat and others.

Youth are the backbone to the nation they change the future of the society with their wellbeing and courageous behavior. They are here us to show that which we have not been willing to look at within ourselves. Unfortunately, today we find most of the youth those who are more interested in others place which are not useful to them, as well as nation. They choose to spend their days playing video games, they spend their nights partying and living it up. More and more young men of this age group are sitting at home in front of the television, playing games all the day instead of bettering themselves or going to work they have no vision and if they do not have dreams, they do not drive to make any attempts at achieving them. Dr. P.N.Mishra, a renowned academician and a famed personality and Mr. Gautam Kothari expressed their faiths in the youth of nation and agreed to become our mentors. Youth forum for right to information is the first of its kind created by enthusiastic and dynamic students of Indore (Madhya Pradesh) which is solely dedicated to create awareness among every individual about the right to information Act. The forum is a non-profit organization and takes the responsibility of educating the masses about the right to information Act which can be used by any citizens to get the desired information from the government. Presently the forum is in the rudimentary stage and is working under the aegis of Utakarsh- a society for social awakening and change. The forum constitutes conveners, Secretaries, treasurer and technical head as office bearers and others members. None of the post in the office is permanently occupied by any person. The functioning of the forum is conducted in a democratic way and elections are held after three months for to the post in the office.

RTI international, a key youth net partner, has a long and successful record of collaboration with public, non- governmental, and private sector institutions in the field of health, population, municipal finance, education and the environment. RTI 's ability to forge productive and collaborative relationships with a broad range of governmental, academic, private and civic institution has been instrumental in its success in achieving sustainable development. Much of the policy reform done by the RTI staff in social sector, reform in the context of economic, public, political, fertility and demographic change.

The right to information staff brings experience, passion and ideological commitment to their works in policy makers, planners and implementers in search of particular solutions to often overwhelming problems. Many right to information act staff concentrated on the most often vulnerable segment of any society, its youth. Areas of expertise include education reform, risk behavior prevention and epidemiology and needs assessment and runaway and homeless youth. Right to information provides basic information. He or She accepts the request forms and provide information sought by the people (3) in each sub-district public information officers (APIOs) who receive request for information and appeals against decisions of the public information officers authorities (4) any person seeking information should file an application in writing or through electronic means in English or Hindi along with the application fees with the PIOs and APIOs.
